

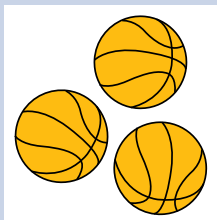

Joining Halsband as Harmony Lodge officers are Michael Frank, vice president; Allen Cowett, secretary; and Stuart Solup, treasurer.



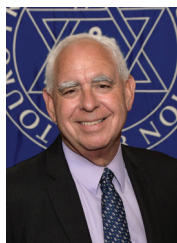

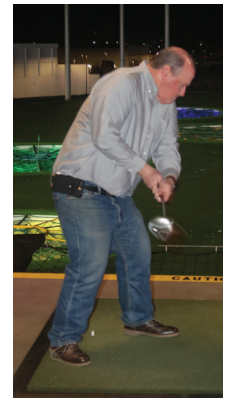

Ian Nicolato Wins March Madness Contest

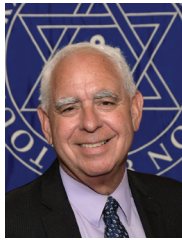

Continuing Our Support for Organizations in Israel

With Israel still very much in the news, the Community Involvement Committee members expressed a strong desire as a Jewish organization for Touro to continue to offer our support.

We donated \$1,800 each to the following organizations: Friends of Israel Defense Forces, Jewish National Fund-USA Israel Resilience Campaign, and American Friends of Magen David Adom. Touro had made a generous donation to these charities after the horrific attack by the Hamas terrorists on October 7, 2023.

We also provided \$2,500 to become a sponsor of the Jewish Culture Fest event that was held on June 2 outside the Jewish Community Center in Providence. It was another way of getting Touro's name and our mission prominently in front of the Jewish community.

The committee met with representatives from Best Buddies and decided to donate \$1,000 in support of the Friendship Walk held at Providence College in April. Best Buddies is a great organization supporting inclusion for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

We renewed our donation of \$5,000 to Adoption Rhode Island in support of foster youth who became tenants of the newly opened Copley Chambers Apartments in Providence, as well as the organization's Forever Siblings Program and Camp Scholarship Program. Part of our donation again this year is targeted for the Healing Arts programming for 15 children in participating groups.

We also provided funding for a new refrigerator at the Renaissance Unit of Tamarisk Senior Living in Warwick, operated by Jewish Collaborative Services.

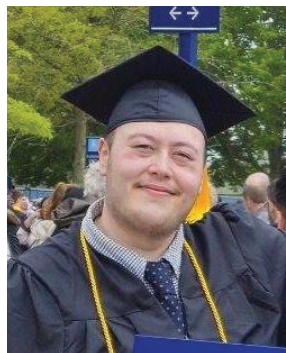

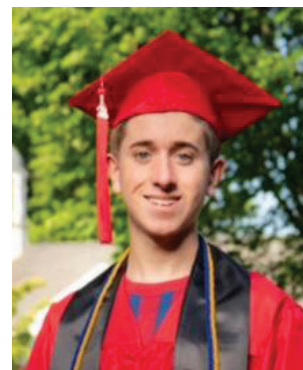

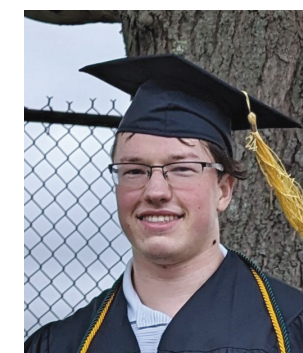

Rhode Island's Anchorman Entertains Touro

The Harmony Lodge meeting on February 28 took place at Chelo's in Warwick. After a great buffet of turkey, steak tips and scrod, we were all entertained by Gene Valicenti, the self-titled "Rhode Island's Anchorman."

Gene not only anchors the nightly news on NBC 10, but he's a morning host on WPRO radio. He has a great self-deprecating sense of humor, regaling us with stories about breaking into the news business as a novice.

Gene grew up in New Jersey, where he developed a knack for storytelling. He wrote for his Weehawken High School newspaper called the Indian Ink and moved on to Fairleigh Dickinson University. In college he worked for WPIX Channel 11 in New York.

He said his early career was a bit rocky -- during his first live street interview at a murder trial, he panicked and was not able to continue, so the station cut to previously recorded material. The next day, even his brother Anthony encouraged him to find a new career. He was working for Channel 26 in Connecticut when the owner of the station replaced the news with a Juiceman infomercial to seek greater profits.

Gene decided it was time to switch careers in 1992 and he almost went to work for AT&T. But he received a call from

Betty-Jo Cugini at Channel 10 in Providence, who had seen his Connecticut broadcasts and thought he would be a good fit. Gene was within seconds of leaving the station since the job interviewer was late, but he's glad he stayed. He has

been at Channel 10 for the past 32 years, although the bushy mustache he sported in the early years is long gone.

Gene was one of the first newsmen on the scene in New York when the Twin Towers came down on September 11, 2001 because he arrived aboard

the Providence Fire Department's canteen truck which supplied food to the first responders.

In addition to his great career on TV, he has been featured from 6 a.m. to 9 a.m. every day at WPRO since 2012. He enjoys both jobs and has earned numerous awards including Emmys, the National Academy of Television Arts and Science Silver Circle honor, Edward R. Murrow awards and he has been inducted into both the RI Heritage and RI Broadcasting Halls of Fame. He has also won a variety of awards for his work on behalf of charitable organizations.

Gene lives in East Greenwich with his wife Diane, who was his high school sweetheart, and they have three daughters.
